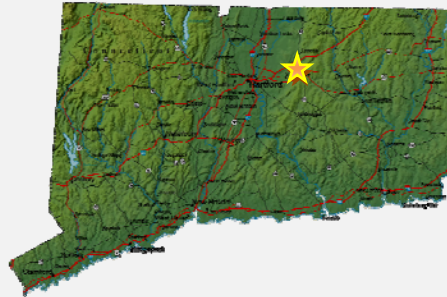


Massacre in Manchester:
