ANNUAL WEEKEND AT THE NATIONAL FIRE ACADEMY OCTOBER 17-19, 2014

The Massachusetts Department of Fire Services will once again be going to the National Fire Academy in Emmitsburg, MD for a weekend of intensive training. This year we check in from 1630 to 1830 hours on Friday, October 17, 2014.

PLEASE NOTE THAT DUE TO HEIGHTENED SECURITY MEASURES, NO STUDENTS WILL BE ALLOWED ON CAMPUS PRIOR TO 1600 AND CHECK IN <u>WILL NOT</u> START BEFORE 1630. IT IS ESSENTIAL THAT YOU HAVE A VALID DRIVER'S LICENSE FOR SECURITY PERSONNEL TO MATCH TO YOUR CLASS ROSTER. YOU SHOULD ALSO <u>EXPECT THAT YOUR VEHICLE AND BAGGAGE WILL BE SEARCHED</u>. ANY CONTRABAND INCLUDING KNIVES AND ALCOHOL WILL BE CONFISCATED.

A <u>MANDATORY</u> welcome dinner and an orientation meeting will take place Friday evening for all participants. Training will begin on Saturday morning at 0800 hours and you will be dismissed from your classroom on Sunday, October 19, 2014 at 1700 hours.

The cost of the program this year is Sixty dollars (\$60.00) and includes all meals beginning with dinner Friday and ending with lunch on Sunday. Transportation to and from Emmitsburg is on your own and car pooling is encouraged. (Note: The closest airport is BWI)

With the increased demand for this weekend, you are encouraged to send in your completed package as soon as possible. We have a limit on the number of students participating. You must pre-register for the weekend, <u>AS WALK-INS ARE NOT ALLOWED</u>. Acceptance to programs will be done on a first come, first serve basis. To ensure that the registration package is complete with all the required documents, a checklist is enclosed. Any student application that is received incomplete will result in a delay in their application being processed.

The deadline for receiving completed applications is no later than 1700 hours on September 5, 2014. Only completed applications at that time will be reviewed for acceptance. Payment must be received with your application. It may be in the form of a bank check, money order, or personal check. Fire department purchase orders may be used to reserve your spot, however payment must be received no later than Friday, September 19, 2014. Payment should be made to the <u>Massachusetts Firefighting Academy Trust Fund</u>. Please note: There will be a \$15.00 charge for bounced checks per 801 CMR 408.

Deadline for Applications is no later than Friday, September 5, 2014 at 1700. For NFA security reasons <u>NO APPLICATIONS</u> will be accepted after the deadline.

The required application is the FEMA General Admissions Application Short Form (FEMA Form 119-25-2) which can be found at: http://www.usfa.fema.gov/downloads/pdf/ff 119 25 2 75 5a.pdf. You must also include the *Massachusetts Department of Fire Services Registration Form* and the \$60 fee. The application *cannot* be submitted online.

Please mail or fax your completed application to: Registrar-NFA WKND, Massachusetts Firefighting Academy, One State Road, Stow, MA 01775. **Needs to include the head of the organization signature and no later than September 5, 2014. Please include a valid email address.

It is required that you register for a FEMA Student Identification Number (SID). This is the number required for section 6 of the application form (no longer using Social Security Numbers) and is obtained through the Center for Domestic Preparedness (CDP). To obtain a SID:

- 3. Follow the instructions to create your account.
- 4. You will receive an email with your SID. Save this number in a secure location.

The standard MFA Application and MFA ID#'s will not be accepted for this program.

If you need to cancel your participation in the Training Weekend, you should do so as soon as possible so we may allow someone else to utilize the spot. COURSE OFFERINGS Course Times: 0800-1700 hours

COURTROOM PREPARATION AND TESTIMONY FOR FIRST RESPONDERS (W0209). This course will provide the necessary tools for all emergency responders who may be called upon for depositions and/or courtroom testimony relevant to facts witnessed on arrival at a scene as a first responder. This 2-day course will emphasize the importance of reporting factual events. It also will address the need to improve report-writing skills after witnessing an event, and oral presentation skills if asked to describe the event in a court of law. The intent of this course is to prepare all emergency responders, with emphases on volunteer firefighters, to present information to the legal system.

Selection Criteria: Open to all interested emergency services personnel, including volunteer, career, and allied professions, who are interested in controlling the arson problem.

<u>EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES: FUNCTIONS IN THE INCIDENT COMMAND SYSTEM (W0166)</u> Students will practice use of the Incident Command System in coordination with other public safety responders. As a follow-up to ICS-100 and ICS-200 training, this course will present scenarios requiring responders to structure their EMS resources within the guidance of NIMS ICS, as appropriate to the needs of the different incident types. Through simulation and role-playing, students will demonstrate the implementation of EMS components in an ICS system at medium- or large-sized incidents.

Selection Criteria: Emergency response personnel with responsibilities to implement the initial EMS functions of an Incident Command System at medium- or large-sized incidents.

INTRODUCTION TO UNIFIED COMMAND FOR MULTI-AGENCY AND CATASTROPHIC INCIDENTS (W0315)

This course is designed for those officers who would likely function in a Command or General Staff position during a multi-agency operation. Students will be exposed to lectures and activities designed to promote a better understanding of multi-agency needs and a Unified Command structure. This course is designed to provide an understanding of the requirements of a Unified Command organization and the skills necessary to operate effectively at complex incidents.

Selection Criteria: Officers who have command responsibilities.

Officers who are upwardly mobile and act in the position of a Command Officer. Officer, regardless of title, who would function in a command or general staff position

during a Unified Command operation.

Those officers who are initially responsible for setting up the Incident Command

organization.

<u>STRATEGY AND TACTICS FOR INITIAL COMPANY OPERATIONS (W0455)</u> STICO is designed to meet the needs of Company Officers responsible for managing the operations of one or more companies during structural firefighting operations. STICO is designed to develop the management skills needed by company officers to accomplish assigned tactics at structure fires.

Selection Criteria: Senior firefighters who may at times assume the responsibilities of the company officer (NFPA 1001, Standard for Fire Fighter Professional Qualifications, Level II).
