




Forest Fire Control and Management NRD 197

Are wildland fires getting larger and more intense? Come learn how we deal with such situations.

Wildland fire has influenced plant and animal life histories, and has been used by humans for generations to shape ecosystems. Lecture is online, labs take place in person as noted for lab section CRN 16367. The semester begins with learning the basic knowledge necessary to become a federally certified wildland fire fighter (S-130/190). Obtaining the S-130 / 190 Certification is one of many steps required for employment as a wildland fire fighter both locally and nationally. The second half of the course focuses on wildland fire as an ecosystem process and the use of prescribed fire as a management tool.

Participation in one 8-hour field day on a weekend is required.
