- 1. We have been working with the DPW to find a solution to the roof problems in the day room at station 2. This week, they were able to identify some areas around the chimney that were open to allow water to enter. These areas have been patched and hopefully will stop some of the flow. On another note, the rubber membrane roof will need to be replaced soon, we are working to get quotes to figure out the cost.
- 2. Just a reminder, any damage that occurs to the physical stations needs to be reported to the Shift Officer and Chief of Department on the proper incident/accident report form. This allows us to ensure that proper repairs are made.
