PERSONNEL

On 9/3, Trevor Bruso will begin as Health Agent for the Town. Most of you may remember Trevor, who worked out of Fire HQ for most of last year.

FIRE PREVENTION

1. With the new school year upon us rather quickly, the School Fire Prevention kicks into gear. We have been busy inspecting all of the WRSD schools in town, ensuring that they are up to code.

VEHICLES

1. We have ordered the replacement ambulance for A2. This will be the same specification as A4 with some minor changes. We had to order it now to keep with the 3 year replacement program as we are not slated to see the new truck sooner than 850 days or around 2.25 years.

MISCELLANEOUS

1. The road construction on Main Street will be continuing through at least mid-September. The contractor will be working on the structures and sidewalks to prepare them for pavement. The traffic is not optimal to say the least, especially with school starting next week. Just be cautious when responding, the traffic patterns and lanes change on a daily basis and the raised structures can create issues for the apparatus.
